## **Before You Depart:**

## You will need to bring......

- >  $\Box$  Valid Passport ( $\geq$  six months' validity)

- Important Documents (original & certified translations):
  - □ Birth Certificates
  - $\Box$  Marriage/divorce certificates; death certificate for a deceased spouse
  - $\Box$  Adoption records for adopted children
  - Educational diplomas/transcripts/certificates
  - $\Box$  Work experience letters
  - □ Immunization/vaccination records
  - □ Driver's licence/ International Driving Permit (IDP)
  - $\Box$  Medical records and dental records
- $\blacktriangleright$  Proof of funds
- Police clearance certificate (if required)
- $\succ$   $\Box$  Flight itinerary and ticket
- ➢ □ Proof Travel Insurance
- Proof of Accommodation (temporary or permanent)
- Packing Essentials:
  - Electronics and adapters (Canada: 120V, 60Hz, and Type A/B plugs)
  - □ Weather-appropriate clothing
  - $\Box$  Other personal items
- Currency exchanges
- Download digital maps (e.g., Google Map)
- ➤ □ Important contacts:
  - Emergency contacts
  - o Immigration lawyer (if applicable)
- Other Situation specific documents as needed

## Upon Arrival in Saint John:

## You will need to know.....

- Landing Process:
  - Present your documents to the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA)
    - □ Confirmation of Permanent Residence (COPR)
    - $\square$  Passport with visa
    - □ Proof of funds / accommodation (if required)
- Be aware of your options of transportation (visit <u>YSJsaintjohn.ca</u> website):
  - Taxi: available at the airport; download Uride app



- o Bus: download SJTRides app or use cash (\$3 per ride) or buy bus pass
- Book a pick-up service in private group
- Rental cars

## After Arrival in Saint John:

- Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- New Brunswick identification (ID) card
- Setting up Utilities and Services:
  - □ Canadian Telephone Number
  - □ Internet (if your accommodation required)
  - Electricity (Saint John Energy or NB Power)
- Canadian Bank Account
- Secure long-term or permanent accommodations
- Healthcare needs:
  - $\Box$  Medicare card
  - $\Box$  Health insurance
  - □ Family Doctor
  - □ Immunizations
  - Community Services (e.g. childcare, subsidies)
- Driver's License:
  - Exchange foreign driver's license (translation if required)
  - □ Obtain a Canadian Driver's license
- Education:
  - o For Children
    - $\Box$  School registration
    - □ Youth programs
    - □ After School Service
    - □ Language training
  - o For Adult
    - □ Language training
    - □ Higher Education Opportunities: UNB, NBCC
